Rules:

- Junior Explorers will not be allowed to exhibit live animals at the fair
- This is a “show and tell” class. Junior Explorer members will share their work with an evaluator.
- Junior Explorers cannot show in any other junior fair department or sell an animal in the livestock sale
- Junior Explorers may bring two exhibits to have on display during the fair
- Exhibitors will receive a special ribbon
- Entry tags must be firmly attached to exhibits

Classes:

Junior Explorers who have just finished Kindergarten

1. Houseplant started from a cutting or seed
2. Simple art, pencil, crayon, or watercolor, 8 ½ x 11 framed or canvas
3. Item made from a kit (model, rocket, craft project, etc.)
4. Fruit or vegetable that exhibitor has grown
5. Simple sewn article (by hand or machine)
6. Display of 5 mounted insects
7. Legos or K’Nex (must be on sturdy cardboard box)
8. Cut flower (wild or homegrown)
9. Any item made at a youth project day or camp

Junior Explorers who have just finished 1st grade

1. Simple art, pencil, crayon, or watercolor, 8 ½ x 11 framed or canvas
2. Simple craft item
3. Garden box-featuring 4 different vegetables or fruits grown by the exhibitor
4. Houseplant that the exhibitor has cared for
5. Cut flowers-wild or homegrown
6. Display of 8 mounted insects
7. Simple woodworking item
8. Simple article sewn by exhibitor
9. Legos or K’Nex (must be on sturdy cardboard box)
10. Any item made at a youth project day or camp

Junior Explorers who have just finished 2nd grade

1. Simple garment or article (knitted, crocheted, sewn)
2. Legos or K’Nex (must be on sturdy cardboard box)
3. Simple electricity project
4. Plate of 3 vegetables-all one type of vegetable
5. House plant or flower bouquet
6. Simple woodworking project, birdhouse, or feeder (kits allowed)
7. Simple craft project
8. Terrarium or dish garden
9. Drawing or painting which can include scratch art-framed or on canvas
10. Any item made at a youth project day or camp
